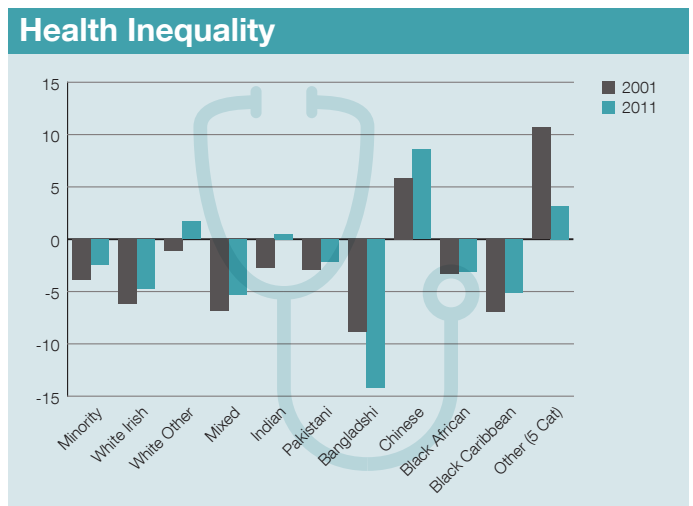
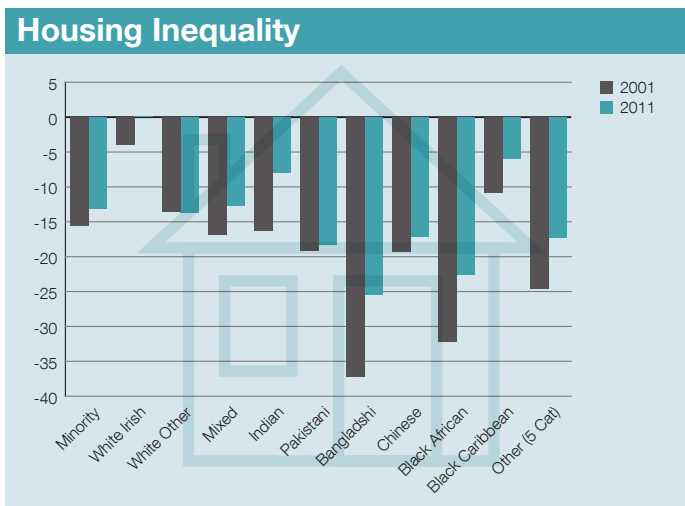
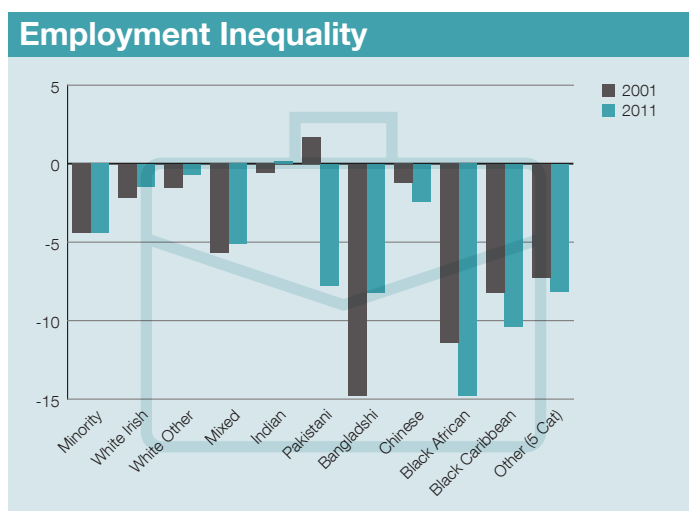
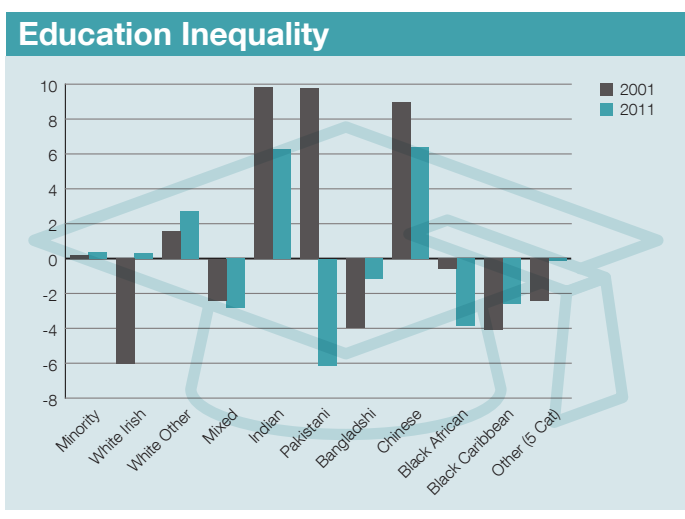
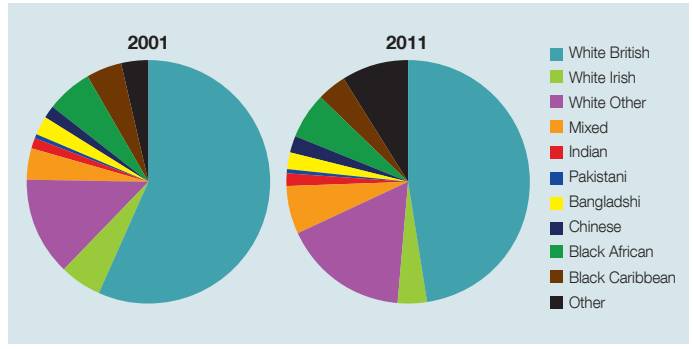


## BOROUGH PROFILE

### Islington

In 2011 Islington was ranked 9th in London (out of 32 London boroughs) for overall inequality. In 2001 it was ranked 7th, representing a small improvement in relative inequality, though gaps between ethnic minorities and White British people remain relatively large in the borough. The Bangladeshi, Black African and Pakistani groups experience the largest overall inequality. In particular Pakistani people saw a substantial worsening in outcomes: in both education and employment they went from having an advantage to a large disadvantage.

## Islington

Between 2001 and 2011 the White British – Minority population split in Islington changed from 57%:43% to 48%:52%. This was predominantly caused by an increase in White Other, Other and Mixed populations.
